VII. Complaints

Licensees: The Commission may discuss, consider and take action on any matter below. The Commission's action may include those set forth in A.R.S. § 32-2321(A), such as an administrative warning, civil penalty up to \$1,000.00 per violation, probation requirements, suspension or revocation. This action may be taken pursuant to a Consent Agreement or a matter may be sent to a Formal Hearing. The Commission may issue an advisory letter pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-2321 (N). A matter also may be continued for further investigation, further settlement negotiations, or dismissed.

If a Consent Agreement is not executed by the deadline stated in the Consent Agreement Transmittal letter, the case will be sent to the Office of Administrative Hearings.

Unlicensed: The Commission may discuss, consider and take action on any matter below. The Commission may take action such as issuing a Cease and Desist order and/or imposing a civil penalty of up to \$1,000.00 for the first offense and up to \$2,000.00 for a subsequent offense, according to A.R.S. § 32-2304(B)(16). Action may be taken by Direct Commission Order without a Consent Agreement or Formal Hearing. A matter also may be continued for further investigation, further settlement negotiations, or dismissed.

A. Burns Pest Elimination (BL)/David Burns (QP)/James Speer (Unlicensed Applicator) - Case # 2005-033 (Mr. Craig)

This complaint contains allegations that Burns Pest Elimination (Burns) applicator James Speer performed pest control services in 2003 and 2004 without having a current applicator license. When Burns hired Mr. Speers, they verified his license status. However, Mr. Speer's applicator license expired on 5-31-03. On 1-28-04, a SPCC inspector observed Mr. Speer performing a pest control treatment. At the time, Mr. Speer informed the SPCC inspector that he was currently licensed, having received his renewal form in the mail, and sent it back. Mr. Speer terminated his employment in 3-04 and was subsequently rehired in 8-04, as a laborer. However, in 9-04, the SPCC learned, via an informant, that Mr. Speer was not licensed. An interview of Burns' supervisory staff indicated that they believed that Mr. Speer's license was renewed, since he also told his superiors that he received his renewed license. However, Mr. Speer did not renew his license and knowingly applied pesticides without a current license. Mr. Speer's license remains expired.

A letter was sent to Mr. Speer to attend a settlement conference, however, the certified letter was returned "unclaimed."

SPCC Staff recommends that this complaint be dismissed against the business license and qualifying party license.

Commission's Options:

- 1. Accept** staff's recommendation to dismiss against the business license and qualifying party license and **Suspend** the applicator license of James Speer due to non-payment of renewal fees and dismiss the complaint without prejudice [license automatically revoked in one year];
- 2.** Send the matter back to settlement conference as it pertains to the business license and qualifying party based on stated factors and rationale and **Suspend** the applicator license of James Speer due to non-payment of renewal fees and dismiss the complaint without prejudice [license automatically revoked in one year]; or
- 3. Reject** the proposed resolution concerning the business license and qualifying party and send the matter to hearing and **Suspend** the applicator license of James Speer due to non-payment of renewal fees and dismiss the complaint without prejudice [license automatically revoked in one year].

B. Charles Stout, Jr. (APP) - Case # 2005-074 (Mr. Craig)

This complaint contains allegations that on 8-5-05, applicator Charles Stout Jr. performed a pretreatment to a site located in Dewey, Arizona. He applied 194.8 gallons. SPCC's investigation revealed that Mr. Stout should have applied 241.03 gallons, shorting the site by 46.28 gallons.

The following proposed resolution was reached:

That **Charles Stout, Jr. APP LIC #030304** be issued an **Administrative Warning and a \$200.00 Civil Penalty (due within 30 days of Commission Order)** pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-2321(A) (Disciplinary action) for a violation of A.R.S. § 32-2321(B)(1) (Violating laws/rules), to wit, A.R.S. § 32-2321(B)(4) (Applying pesticides in a manner contrary to the label) and A.A.C. R4-29-402 (Failed to apply the correct amount for square footage).

Commission's Options:

- 1. Accept** the proposed resolution;

2. Return the matter to settlement conference to **Modify** the proposed resolution based on stated factors and rationale; or
3. **Reject** the proposed resolution and send the matter to hearing.

C. Neat Control Company (BL)/Phillip Douglas (QP) - Case # 2005-078 (Mr. Craig)

This complaint contains allegations that for three months in 2005, Neat Control Company Qualifying Party, Phillip Douglas, knowingly applied pesticides without an applicator license. Additionally, Mr. Douglas failed to provide pesticide application records pursuant to the SPCC's 24-Hour Records Request. Mr. Douglas' applicator license expired on 5-31-97.

The following proposed resolution was reached:

1. That **Neat Control Company, BUS LIC #2036** be issued an **Administrative Warning and a \$200.00 Civil Penalty (due within 30 days of Commission Order)** pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-2321 (A) (Disciplinary action) for a violation of A.R.S. § 32-2321(B)(1) (Violating laws/rules), to wit, A.R.S. § 32-2325(B)(4) (Applying pesticides without an applicator license) (due to A.R.S. § 32-2328 (Joint Responsibility)) and A.A.C. R4-29-309(A) (Failed to comply with 24-Hour Records Request).
2. That **Phillip Douglas, QP LIC #1506** be issued an **Administrative Warning and a \$1,200.00 Civil Penalty (due within 90 days of Commission Order (payment of civil penalties shall consist of three installments of \$400.00 each, due on 5/19/06, 6/19/06 and 7/19/06 respectively))** pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-2321(A) (Disciplinary action) for a violation of A.R.S. § 32-2321(B)(1) (Violating laws), to wit, A.R.S. § 32-2325(B)(4) (Applying pesticides without an applicator license).

Commission's Options:

1. **Accept** the proposed resolution;
2. Return the matter to settlement conference to **Modify** the proposed resolution based on stated factors and rationale; or
3. **Reject** the proposed resolution and send the matter to hearing.

D. Ant Brian Exterminating (BL)/Brian Oldham (QP) - Case # 2005-075 (Mr. Craig)

This complaint contains allegations that from 6-05 to 8-05, Ant Brian Exterminating Qualifying Party, Brian Oldham, performed pest control services without maintaining insurance. SPCC staff also noted that Mr. Oldham failed to submit Termite Action Report Forms (TARFs) for twenty-seven wood destroying insect inspection reports he issued. Additionally, Mr. Oldham failed to comply with a SPCC 24-Hour Records Request.

The following proposed resolution was reached:

1. That **Ant Brian Exterminating, BUS LIC #8369** be issued an **Administrative Warning and a \$600.00 Civil Penalty, complete and submit TARFs for the 27 WDIIRs addressed in this investigation and pay the TARF fees and late fees totaling \$432.00 (due within 30 days of Commission Order)** pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-2321(A) (Disciplinary action) for a violation of A.R.S. § 32-2321(B)(1) (Violating laws/rules), to wit, A.R.S. § 32-2321(B)(12) (Failed to provide current proof insurance), A.A.C. R4-29-206(B) (Failed to terminate pest control activities when not insured), A.A.C. R4-29-417(A) (Failed to submit TARFs), A.A.C. R4-29-309(A) (Failed to comply with 24-Hour Records Request) and A.A.C. R4-29-107(A) (Failed to respond in writing to the complaint). **If all the TARFs are not fully and timely submitted, and the TARF fees not paid in full by the due date, the business license of Ant Brian Exterminating will be SUSPENDED for thirty (30) days from the due date. If all the TARFs and TARF fees and Civil Penalties are not submitted and paid in full, within the thirty-day (30) suspension period, the business license of Ant Brian Exterminating shall be REVOKED on the day after the 30-day suspension.**

2. That **Brian Oldham, QP LIC #2029** be issued an **Administrative Warning and a \$200.00 Civil Penalty (due within 60 days of Commission Order)** pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-2321(A) (Disciplinary action) for a violation of A.R.S. § 32-2321(B)(1) (Violating rules), to wit, A.A.C. R4-29-309(A) (Failed to comply with 24-Hour Records Request) and A.A.C. R4-29-107(A) (Failed to respond in writing to the complaint). **If all Civil Penalties are not fully and timely submitted, by the due date, the qualifying party license of Brian Oldham will be SUSPENDED for thirty (30) days from the due date. If all the Civil Penalties are not submitted and paid in full, within the thirty-day (30) suspension period, the qualifying party license of Brian Oldham shall be REVOKED on the day after the 30-day suspension.**

Commission's Options:

1. **Accept** the proposed resolution;

2. Return the matter to settlement conference to **Modify** the proposed resolution based on stated factors and rationale; or
3. **Reject** the proposed resolution and send the matter to hearing.

E. Tacit Services, LLC (BL), John McClure (QP), John Geiss (APP), Ryan Gielow (APP) - Case # 2005-020 (Mr. Craig)

This complaint alleges that from 1/03-1/05, Mr. McClure “rented” his QP and BL licenses to Mr. Gielow who was purportedly operating a branch office of Tacit Services, but was in essence running his own business. Also, Mr. Gielow was doing work in one category in which Mr. McClure doesn’t hold a QP license. They failed to complete WDIIRs and many WDIIRs did have TARFs submitted for them. At the 3/10/06 Commission Meeting, the Commission accepted a proposed consent agreement to resolve this matter with respect to Tacit Services, Qualifying Party John McClure and Applicator John Geiss. The Commission did not accept the proposed resolution for Ryan Gielow, so it was renegotiated and is being resubmitted to the Commission.

The following proposed resolution was reached:

That **Ryan Gielow, APP LIC #880129** be issued an **Administrative Warning and pay a \$300.00 Civil Penalty (due within 30 days of Commission Order)** pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-2321(A) (Disciplinary action) for a violation of A.R.S. § 32-2321(B)(1) (Violating laws/rules), to wit, A.R.S. § 32-2321(B)(15) (Failed to make and maintain treatment records) and A.A.C. R4-29-413(A) (WDIIRs missing required information).

Commission’s Options:

1. **Accept** the proposed resolution;
2. Return the matter to settlement conference to **Modify** the proposed resolution based on stated factors and rationale; or
3. **Reject** the proposed resolution and send the matter to hearing.

F. Sexton Exterminating (BL)/Rick Sexton (QP/APP) - Case # 2005-072 (Mr. Craig)

This complaint contains allegations that on 5-16-05, applicator Rick Sexton, of Sexton Exterminating, performed a pretreatment to a site located in Payson, Arizona. He measured the pretreat site as 295 linear feet and 2,218 square feet and applied 357 gallons of termiticide. SPCC staff determined the correct measurements were 316 linear feet and 2,613 square feet, requiring 387 gallons. Mr. Sexton shorted the site by

an overall total of 30 gallons. Mr. Sexton also failed to record the correct address on the treatment records and the records were void of the restricted use environmental protection agency (EPA) registration number.

The following proposed resolution was reached:

1. That **Sexton Exterminating BUS LIC #5465** be issued an **Administrative Warning and pre-report all pretreatments for a period of six (6) months (beginning 30 days from the entered date of the Commission Order)** pursuant to A.R.S. §32-2321(A) (Disciplinary action) for a violation of A.R.S. § 32-2321(B)1 (violating rules), to wit, A.A.C. R4-29-402A) (Applied incorrect amount to pretreat site) (due to A.R.S. § 32-2328 (Joint Responsibility)), A.A.C. R4-29-307(A)(B) (Failed to record correct address on treatment records) and A.A.C. R4-29-308(B)(3) (Restricted use record void of EPA registration number).
2. That **Rick Sexton QP LIC #1953** be issued an **Administrative Warning** pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-2321(A)(Disciplinary action) for a violation of A.R.S. § 32-2321(B)(1) (violating rules), to wit, A.A.C. R4-29-402(A) (Applied incorrect amount to pretreat site) (due to A.R.S. § 32-2328 (Joint Responsibility)).
3. That **Rick Sexton APP LIC #891018** be issued an **Administrative Warning and pay a \$500.00 Civil Penalty (due within 30 days of the Commission Order)** pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-2321(A) (Disciplinary action) for a violation of A.R.S. § 32-2321(B)(1) (violating rules), to wit, A.A.C. R4-29-402(A) (Applied incorrect amount to pretreat site).
